

Sharing the Blessings of the Year Christmas & Year-End Giving Opportunities


With the year drawing to a close, now is a time when many parishioners offer a year-end gift to Presentation, making the most of their donation thanks to various tax benefits. The deductions allowed by the IRS for charitable giving help individuals grow their generosity and help our parish continue its mission.

Did you know that...

- *You don't have to use cash to make your gift donate appreciated securities instead. The deduction is the same as for a cash gift, and you pay no capital gains tax on the transfer.
- *You can also transfer your Required Minimum Distribution to Presentation directly without having to pay income tax on the transfer. Simply coordinate for a "Qualified Charitable Distribution."
- *Give an asset that may help us more than it's helping you such as a life insurance policy whose coverage your family no longer needs, or real estate like a second home or a parcel of undeveloped land, or valuable collections or artwork you no longer have room to display.
- *You can make a gift that costs you nothing during your lifetime name your parish as a beneficiary of your will or revocable trust, or of your retirement plan.
- *You can make Presentation a partner in your giving you can deed us your home but continue to live there.
- *Will my employer match my gift? Many companies offer to match an employee's gift, but there may be an issue with matching gifts to religious institutions. If you have a question or issue regarding matching gifts, contact Bob Rooney.

A Body Prepared

Saving God, you shepherd your flock and give new life. Preparing to welcome the king of all nations, we call upon your name. Let us see your face, guide us to serenity so we can discern your will. Grant us the courage to respond to you. Come to save us! Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sunday, December 22, 2024 Leaping for Joy

Today's readings: Micah 5:1–4a; Psalm 80:2–3, 15–16, 18–19; Hebrews 10:5–10; Luke 1:39–45. Just before today's Gospel, the angel Gabriel tells Mary that she will "bear a son" (Luke 1:31). As confirmation of the pregnancy, Gabriel says that Elizabeth, is also pregnant. Since Elizabeth is past childbearing age, Gabriel implies that if Elizabeth is pregnant, Mary can be as well: "for nothing will be impossible for God" (1:37). Finally, when Elizabeth greets Mary, we hear that she is blessed because she "believed that what was spoken . . . by the Lord would be fulfilled."

This fulfillment is proclaimed in the first reading as Micah shares his prophecy of salvation: "From you shall come forth for me / one who is to be ruler in Israel / . . . / his greatness / shall reach to the ends of the earth; / he shall be peace." The Letter to the Hebrews tells of Jesus' sacrifice for the forgiveness of our sins, for as is sung in the refrain of the responsorial psalm, "we shall be saved."

Knowing this, Elizabeth exclaims, "the infant in my womb leaped for joy" the moment she heard Mary's greeting. Overcome by the Holy Spirit, mother and son anticipated the coming of the Lord. As we enter the final week of Advent, how can you ready yourself so that you, too, can leap for joy when the Lord approaches?
